Birthday Imagine goes back in time ánd looks ahead with 1984 Re:Imagined

With guest of honour and visual effects pioneer Phil Tippett

From 24 October to 3 November in LAB111, De FilmHallen and Galerie Beeldend Gesproken

Imagine Fantastic Film Festival is forty years young this year. The quirky genre festival celebrates the anniversary with a main theme where the spirit of Big Brother and its spiritual father George Orwell is emphatic. American visual effects wizard Phil Tippett, known for pioneering contributions to Star Wars, Jurassic Park, Robocop and Starship Troopers, among others, will receive the Career Achievement Award. This year's Imagine takes place from 24 October to 3 November at De FilmHallen, LAB111 and Galerie Beeldend Gesproken in Amsterdam. 1984 Re:Imagined

Was it coincidence or foresight that the iconic Orwellian year 1984 was the birth year of Imagine Fantastic Film Festival, of all places? What began modestly as The Weekend of Terror transformed into the leading genre festival in the Netherlands in which sci-fi, cult, fantasy and art are equally represented alongside horror. With the main theme 1984 Re:Imagined, the festival will use a number of classics (including film adaptations of the dystopian sci-fi novels 1984 and Fahrenheit 451) and recent films to find out what lessons we can learn from the past today - 75 years after the publication of Orwell's classic. After all, in the words of George Orwell, 'He who controls the past controls the future; he who controls the present controls the past'.

Guest of honour and Career Achievement Award: Phil Tippett

1984 also saw the release of Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom in cinemas: one of many Spielberg productions to which Phil Tippett, this year's guest of honour at Imagine, made a creative contribution. One of his very first jobs was an instant hit, with the iconic holographic chess set aboard the Millenium Falcon in Star Wars: A New Hope. In The Empire Strikes Back, Tippett's part was even greater, and as a dino-supervisor, he was the link between analogue and digital magic in Jurassic Park. His long, rich career is one full of highlights. For Paul Verhoeven, he breathed life into Robocop's competitor ED-209 and the alien hordes who take the Starship Troopers' lives. As the founder and namesake of Tippett Studios, he very recently featured in the credits of Alien: Romulus. Phil Tippet, besides being a creative and technical jack-of-all-trades, is also a director, whose Imagine Mad God re-shows. The two-time Oscar winner will hopefully still have his Emmys and BAFTA statuette spot in the trophy case for the Imagine Career Achievement Award, as he will be presented with that very well-deserved accolade this year.
